<b>DATA</b>  <b>Reliable collection, clear methods</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• I'm not clear about data I have collected</li> <li>• I have very few samples in my data set</li> <li>• I have not displayed the data using a table or chart that makes it easy to notice and understand patterns</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• I have a good set of data that I can divide into categories or show change over time</li> <li>• I selected a chart or table that shows patterns in the data</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• My data set and categories are clearly defined</li> <li>• The type of table or chart is the best match for the type of data I have.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• I know my data well and can discuss details about how it was collected</li> <li>• I can describe how I decided to use a specific type of table or chart, and the advantages it offers</li> </ul>
<b>DESIGN</b> <b>Appearance, contrast, readability</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The data is on a table or chart</li> <li>• The image is difficult to view because of color combinations or size decisions</li> <li>• The numbers or words are difficult to interpret</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The table or chart is clearly displayed</li> <li>• The color or size of the image allows viewers to make comparisons</li> <li>• The numbers or words are legible</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The table or chart is pleasant to look at</li> <li>• The color or size of the image helps viewers make comparisons</li> <li>• The numbers or words are easily readable</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The table or chart has an artistic quality</li> <li>• The colors and shapes used enhance the experience</li> <li>• The numbers and words have excellent readability</li> </ul>
<b>STORY</b> <b>Communicates a message</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• It is not clear why this data was measured for this project</li> <li>• The presentation or text is vague about the importance of the data</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• There is a link or correlation between the topic and the data</li> <li>• This data is a good way to show cause and effect between variables</li> <li>• The chart or table provides clues about what may cause the changes or lack of change in the data</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The topic and the data are clearly related</li> <li>• The data and display illustrates cause and effect between variables</li> <li>• The chart or table shows some patterns of change or stability over time or in different conditions</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The data displayed is a strong support to the speaker's message</li> <li>• The chart or table can "tell" the story</li> <li>• The chart or table shows clear patterns of change or stability over time or in different conditions</li> </ul>
<b>SOURCES</b> <b>Identifies information for further investigation, thanks others (authors, classmates, teachers) for help</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Identifies only search engines--"Google," "DISCUS,"</li> <li>OR</li> <li>• Has no identified sources</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Has 1 clearly-identified source of information or image credit</li> <li>• Uses title &amp; author specific web address</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Has 2 clearly-identified sources of information or images</li> <li>• Uses academic expectations (author, title, location/publisher, date).</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Provides 3 or more well-identified sources from a variety of different media;</li> <li>• Annotated: Identifies what came from which source</li> </ul>
